Interpreting Your ILTS Score Report

Your ILTS score report provides your results and a description of your performance for the test taken on the test date.

1 Status

If you received a scaled total test score of 240 or above, you will receive a "Pass" status. If you received a scaled total test score below 240, you will receive a "Did not pass" status.

2 Scaled Total Test Score

Your scaled total test score is reported on a scale from 100 to 300. Your scaled total test score is based on the number of multiple-choice questions you answered correctly.

3 Subarea Score

Your subarea scores are reported on a scale from 100 to 300 and provide feedback on your performance by subarea. This descriptive-only information may help you assess your strengths and weaknesses.

Multiple-Choice Information

Each multiple-choice question counts the same toward the total test score. Points are not "lost" for wrong answers.

4 Performance Graph

The performance graph illustrates each subarea score on a scale from 100 to 300.

Passing Score

To pass this test, you must obtain a scaled total test score of 240 or above.

5 Reporting

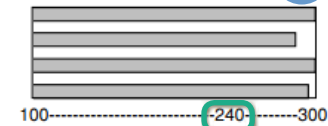
